# History Project

We are pleased to report that things are now falling into place for the production of a CD Rom of the history of the ATHS. We hope to have it available for our lunch in October. *Bryce Kohler* has written several chapters and photos are being scanned ready for inclusion in the production.

The History Sub-committee has been working to raise funding. Donations have been received with more promised. Levels of giving will be acknowledged. The ultimate object is the production of a book which you will be able to exhibit with pride in your home. Present indications are that many old Scholars want either the CD Rom or the book and some want both.

Just after Easter, about 3600 history project surveys were mailed to all old scholars on the database. The purpose was to provide *Bryce*, with details of the paths which old scholars had traced since school days and particularly how the emphasis on academic excellence in school had affected their lives.

We have been overwhelmed with the immediate response, and at time of writing, 160 had been returned, including some from interstate and overseas, giving *Bryce* a valuable source of information for his writing.

The successful conclusion of this project will keep the spirit of ATHS alive and well.

# Reunion-Class of '53

First year 1953 had dinner at the Adelaide Bowling Club on Tuesday 17 Feb 2004 to reminisce about school days and meet people who mostly they had not seen for nearly fifty years. The late *Lyndon Nelsen* first proposed the reunion after the 1993 Picnic. His idea was for a get together in 1995. Assistance from the OSA helped trace people, but nothing happened. With *Lyndon's* untimely death in 2003 after a lengthy illness the idea seemed likely to lapse forever.



*Peter Carter* revived it in late 2003 suggesting a 50 year reunion. We decided on a date in Feb 2004 and *Peter, Dean Eldridge, Kingsley Gould, Graham Maskell, Bob Stone, Warren West* and *Dean Whitford* organised the event. Again the OSA gave valuable assistance. We particularly thank *Ron Clark* for his help.



Following the Tech tradition of separation of the sexes, the event was limited to male old scholars. This was rationalised on the basis of the difficulty of finding people who mostly had changed their names and the short lead time we had available. The true reasons are probably too deep-seated in our collective psyches to be identified, but the Tech is the common factor. We found contact details for about 70 old scholars (intake about 80). Most were interested in attending. Some had other commitments on the night.



Of the 47 present, special mention must be made of the *Tabor* twins, *Adrian and Ralph*, who travelled from NSW and Victoria respectively (or possibly vice-versa, they still look too alike to be sure). We were also fortunate to have the company of *Bryce Kohler* and *Eric Tamlin*, who were involved with first year English and science classes in 1953. Their ability to recognise people and remember names was astonishing, especially when all of those present (except me) looked so different.



The evening passed in an orgy of discussion, much of it starting "what about when...." Or "do you remember....", in what seemed far less time than should have been available. What was notable was the range of career paths undertaken by former students. There can be no doubt that the school provided a sound basic education for almost anything we wanted to do.



The venue was ideal. We are all grateful to *Dean Eldridge* for his arrangements. The one complaint was, not enough time to catch up with everyone and many expressed the wish that similar functions be organised in the future.
